A SEVEN LAKES
Our gardens are set within a tranquil valley, at the heart, a series of seven lakes play host to an array of wildlife.

B CORONATION GARDEN
Planted in 1952 to mark the coronation of Queen Elizabeth II. This garden features many rhododendron Loderi.

C LODERI GARDEN
With a magical feel, this is the oldest part of the garden, with large old rhododendrons, huge conifers & hidden palm trees.

D DOLLS' HOUSE MUSEUM
A magical world awaits you at the famous 'Beyond The Dolls' House' exhibition.

E CAFÉ & PICNICS
The Clocktower Café offers a selection of hot and cold beverages, light lunches, cakes & pastries.

F MAIN ENTRANCE
Welcome centre, gift shop and garden centre.

G ROCK GARDEN
Created in 1900 our famous Rock Garden is one of the most beautiful areas of the gardens.

H THE ENGINE HOUSE
The Engine House once pumped water up to the top of the valley. It is a stunning spot for views across the lakes. Seasonal refreshments available.

I LEONARDSLEE HOUSE
The stunning Italianate mansion house is home to Restaurant Interlude, Afternoon Tea and Stay at Leonardslee House and Art Gallery & Sculpture Sales

J THE VINEYARD
In 2018 we planted the UK's first Pinotage Vineyard. Whilst our vines are maturing, why not enjoy a wine tasting from our sister property in South Africa, Benguela Cove Lagoon Wine Estate.

L CAMELLIA GROVE
Several hundred varieties of camellia, mostly Japonica, were planted here in 1957-58.
